
I first came to The Women's Shelter on April 30, 2018. A few weeks prior to that my life was completely out of control. My drug use had taken over my whole life. I was living with my mom and my son but because of my aggressive and hostile behavior I was asked to leave her home. My son and I moved in with my sister and her family. After about a week I was told to leave, once again, because of my drug use. I was at the end of the road, no place to go, and no one in my family trusted me at all.

I called The Women's Shelter the morning of April 30, 2018 and was asked to come by and talk to Ms. Angie. I did just that. I arrived and was embraced with compassion and love. I didn't expect to be able to move in that day but I was asked when I wanted to come in and I told her that I wanted to stay

right now if possible. It WAS possible!! I was welcomed into my new family at that very moment. I walked in crying, scared and "pill-sick". Each lady welcomed me with a smile, a hug and an encouraging word. It was at that moment I realized that I was not alone and that I was loved and that I mattered to someone other than my babies.

I was fortunate to have my sister agree to care for my son while I tried to sort out the mess I had made of my life. That was a blessing. The staff and other residents loved me and believed in me until I was able to believe in myself. It was here that I learned to trust people again. I was given tools to curb my aggression and was able to show compassion and empathy for others.

The most important thing I have learned so far is to take care of "me" first then I would be able to care for others especially my babies. I will always remember one of the staff members telling me this phrase "choose me over we". At first, I thought that meant to



As the days turned into weeks I began to understand what those four words meant. To me it is a simple reminder that if I don't take care of ME then I will not be able to take care of my

children. I was able to reconnect with myself, my values, and the morals that I had been raised with but had strayed away from.

I was spiritually asleep when I first arrived but today I can honestly say that my spirit is wide awake. I am beyond grateful for The Women's Shelter and every person on staff for their commitment to my growth and success. Today, I have my life back and for that I AM GRATEFUL!
