Kathy Riley was to write the 40th year celebration article but I ended up seizing the job and Kathy graciously let me step in. But hey, I know the concept like I know the back of my hand. I've heard Kathy say it 1,000 times, **"it's a simple idea, offer some soup and bread, a pre-holiday date, local entertainment, and ask for a small donation for the "meal". Keep education and public awareness of the homeless problem a priority."** I've come to know it well because of the example she sets.

What is most important about the concept is the community wants to know its own weaknesses so it can help because our community really wants the goodness to rise to the surface. In previous newsletters, the common thread was often reflecting on the past. She was talking about relationships. Among the many: Chick-fil-A friends who run the Souper kitchen; Eastminster Presbyterian friends who ready the facility before we arrive, who even clean up after the event; the servers/hosts; musician; steadfast shelter volunteers serving tea, managing ticket sales, working the raffle, and breaking it all down when the night is over; the lovely Shelter staff, steadfast and cheerful

even at the onslaught of the abundance of pre-event planning; and you all, **"the faithful individuals and families who have chosen to spend the Thursday before Thanksgiving with us at Eastminster. Our sincere appreciation to everyone for your love and support. I would like to believe that the "Souper" is going to be around a long time."**

All this is meant to keep the shelter doors open. Most of you know that after many years we now have air conditioning; there is also a cheerful space for not only AA and NA meetings, but budgeting classes, yoga, etc. in preparation for getting women back on their own, reclaiming their lives. Often the shelter is full to the max, but there are times when we cannot hold on to those who sought help. There's no magic, there's no formula except it's a simple idea, like the Souper, like Field of Dreams, "build it they will come." And they do.

We invite you, our friends, to come experience hope. Yes, even sponsor Souper tables, if you can, the details are enclosed. Honor a woman you admire, or a man, or a group, but then bring your friends, family, colleagues to enjoy this special tradition a week before Thanksgiving. They too will be reminded that homelessness is not just in California, New York, Florida, Texas, Washington and countless countries in the news, it's right here in our community. Come join us. It's one way to become involved and what a great way to bring in the holiday season. I can think of none.
